# Meridiam, European Biomass and Bank of the Territories launch in France a unique industrial complex in the world as a sustainable alternative to coal

In the presence of Emmanuelle Wargon, Secretary of State to the Minister of State, Minister of Ecological and Solidarity Transition, Meridiam, Européenne de Biomasse and Banque des Territoires are proud to officially launch today the construction of the first production unit of HPCI® black pellet, a new generation biofuel, combined with a biomass cogeneration plant, at the Pomacle Bazancourt Bio-Economy Centre in the Grand Est region near Reims.

This first of its kind industrial complex in France is a world first. It consists of two installations that contribute to the energy transition by producing 100% renewable energy in a circular economy:

- A production unit for two biofuels: a biomass fuel for the cogeneration plant located on site, and HPCI® black pellet, a new generation biofuel for industrial use. These pellets will replace coal for heating about 130,000 people.
- A cogeneration plant that produces both electricity (90 GWh per year, or the domestic consumption of 30,000 inhabitants) and thermal energy (130GWh per year in the form of steam and hot water) to supply the biofuel production unit, as well as the ADM Chamtor plant located in the Bio-economy cluster.

The cogeneration plant is scheduled to come on stream in June 2020, and HPCI® black pellet production from October 2020.

The use of these wood pellets, the new generation HPCI® black pellet biofuels, under European Biomass license, represents a double innovation :

- Production by a steam cracking process (wood processing, subjected to high temperature and high pressure). This process, which gives it its dark colour, gives it a higher energy potential, very high water resistance and a limited dust content. These properties make it directly usable as a substitute for coal, supporting the same logistics (external storage) and burning in the same boilers.
- The creation of an industrial alternative to coal to provide renewable, local and environmentally friendly energy for the equivalent of heating for 130,000 inhabitants

This project, led by partners who are resolutely committed to the long term, constitutes a new model of virtuous, inclusive and sustainable economic development, designed to benefit the energy transition and the prosperity of local ecosystems. Representing an investment of €100 million, these facilities will produce green electricity, thermal energy and biofuel locally to replace coal.

In compliance with the highest environmental requirements (supply of clean wood, no odours emitted, water contained in the wood used for the industrial process, recovery of combustion ash for the surrounding land), the project will contribute to the reduction of nearly 230,000 tons of CO2 emissions per year over the coming decades, equivalent to the emissions of 145,000 cars. This project contributes directly to the achievement of the sustainable development objectives set by the UN and in particular the fight against climate change and its impacts.

Resolutely based on the circular economy model, this new production site also contributes to the creation of 350 full-time local jobs. Indeed, the Pomacle site will employ 40 people and its activity will contribute to the development of 310 jobs in the biomass sector in the East of France.

Meridiam, Européenne de Biomasse and Banque des Territoires have created a dedicated company, FICA HPCI, to manage the project, the management and the operation of these facilities. These three companies hold 80.5%, 5% and 14.5% respectively of FCIA HPCI.
